Mr Ma took the opportunity to introduce the West Kowloon Cultural District project being planned in Hong Kong. The project will be developed as a cultural and creative focal point in the Asia-Pacific region.

During his trip, Mr Ma also visited the National RFID Industrialisation (Shanghai) Base. He toured the showroom and production line to learn about the development and application of RFID technology in Shanghai, as well as to explore co-operation in the area.

Together with the delegation, Mr Ma also visited the

Shanghai World Expo Coordination Bureau and met with its Director, Mr Hong Hao. They toured the construction site of the Shanghai World Expo and gained a better understanding of the plans and arrangements for the expo to prepare for Hong Kong's participation in the event.

Mr Ma, and the Permanent Secretary for Commerce and Economic Development (Communications and Technology), Mrs Rita Lau, also paid a courtesy call on the Vice Mayor of Shanghai, Mr Tang Dengjie, to share views on the development of creative industries and economic relation between Hong Kong and Shanghai.


